Every morning the arstists choose their performance locations and times for the respective festival day. In the **daily program** you find the performance schedule of each day and a map of the festival site. It is available in printed form at all Infopoints at the beginning of every festival day (Thu 4 p.m., Fri & Sat 2 p.m.) and can be downloaded from the website a little earlier.

The performances start every hour on the hour at 40 locations.



PROGRAM SPECIALS

In addition to performances on the streets and squares around the city centre, special programs can be discovered.

The **"Kaleidoscope"** revue shows at the LINZ AG Spectacle Tent take you on a journey through the variety of street performing. The venues **"Spectacle Oases"** are equipped with seating and are located away from the hustle and bustle of the festival.
